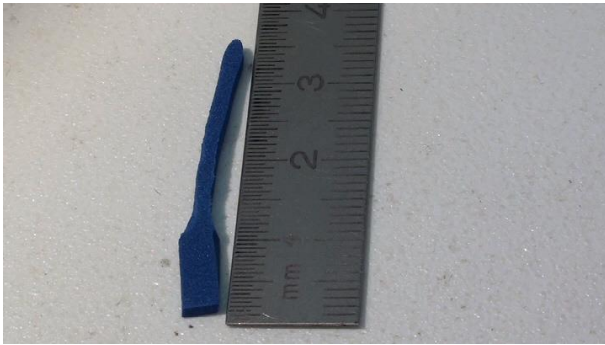
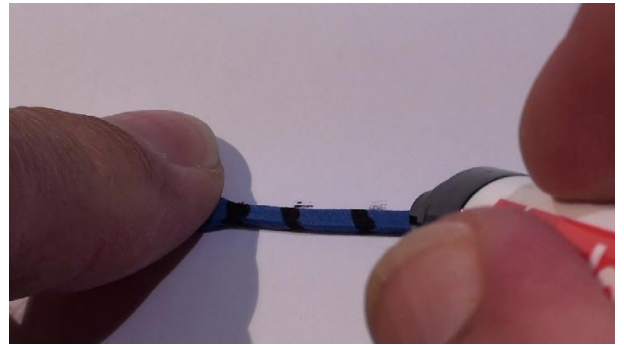


Blue Damsell

Hook:	TMC206BL #10-14
Thread:	Black 8/0
Extended body:	Blue polycelon or foam
Body cover:	Blue polycelon or foam
Wings:	CDC whiten
Body:	Tying thread
Plus:	Black permanent marker



1. Cut a strip of foam as shown above



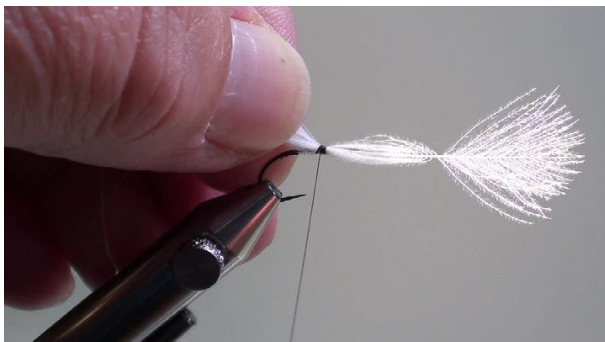
2. Use a black marker pen to simulate the segments of the extended body



3. Insert a dark CDC feather in a paper clip and trim off the quill



4. Tie in the thread at the eye of the hook
5. Wind it in close touching turns to the curvature of the hook
6. Then, wind the thread back to the center of the hook shank



7. Tie in a white CDC feather as shown here



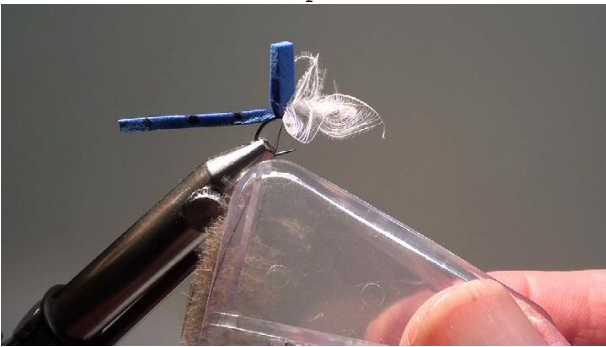
8. Pull the first free feather tip along the quill on both sides to create the first 2 wings



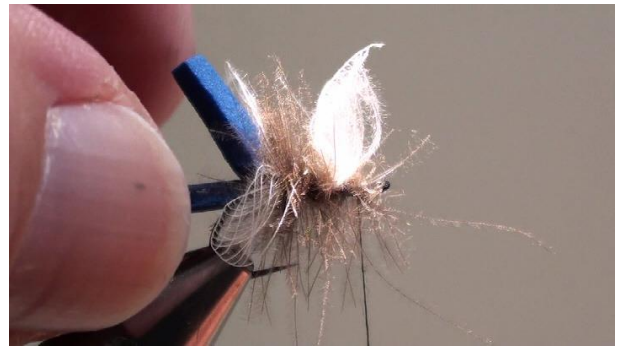
- 9. Tie in a second white CDC feather pointing to the curvature of the hook.
- 10. Create the next 2 wings as described in point 8



- 11. Tie in the extended body at the beginning of the curvature of the hook



- 12. Insert the dark CDC feather tips into the split thread



- 13. Wind the body of the fly



- 14. Flip the foam over the wings to the front of the fly

- 15. Tie off the foam strip behind the eye of the hook



- 16. Whipfinish

- 17. Adjust the position of the wings under the wing case
